Today, more and more youngsters are falling a prey to obesity, the problem of being overweight. A recent survey pointed out that 26 percent of those examined were overweight and 4.2 percent plain obese. Death rate among youngsters has gone up on account of non-communicable diseases like heart problems caused by obesity. It is indeed ironic that while on the one hand we are struggling to find the problem of undernourished children, we have on the other hand the problem of excessive nutrition.

Plumpness is generally attributed to hormonal problems, but that is only in the case of 6 per cent cases. It is the lifestyle and the environment one grows up in that matter more. After school, kids used to play out in the field, but today they go either for the T.V remote control or their computer games. The junk food culture, especially in the homes of working parents only add to their lard.

This problem needs to be tackled in childhood, because health experts caution that obesity can lead to a host of deadly diseases like diabetes and high blood pressure. Parents should regulate the food habits of the children while schools need to encourage active involvement of children in outdoor activities and modify their canteen menus. If the generation next does not get back into action now, as in the United States, obesity will be declared an epidemic in India too.
